The Interreg IV A Project “BeltLogistics”

Background

BeltLogistics aims at establishing cross-border cooperation between associations and public authorities dealing with the transport and logistics sector including the knowledge and research institutions as well.

The fact-finding tour to Køge in Denmark is an opportunity for German companies, public authorities and educational institutions to get information about how Port of Køge and the Scandinavian Transport Centre combine their activities and make strategic planning for future initiatives.

Furthermore the transport center plays an important role as being a distribution center for one of the biggest supermarket groups in Denmark, Netto. With its close proximity to Greater Copenhagen the location of the transport center plays a vital role as a supplier to many of the retail businesses of the Capital Region.

Port of Køge and Skandinavisk Transport Center are both owned by the municipality of Køge and are run like a single company with the same leadership and operation. This type of organization underlines the intentions of having a united logistics cluster in Køge.

The project “BeltLogistics” was initiated by Wirtschaftsförderung Lübeck GmbH and Roskilde University in connection with the development scheme of the “Fehmarnbelt-Region” 2007-2013 through the EU support program INTERREG IVA.
