Background:

The seminar "Future requirements of the Logistics Infrastructure in the Fehmarnbelt Region – development of industrial areas and real estate" is an add-on to the previous workshop about Logistics Infrastructure and challenges and opportunities.

Lolland-Falster is set to become Denmark's growth centre over the coming years and visions for the region are monumental in scale. Within seven years, 11 billion Euros will be invested in regional construction projects, which include the game-changing Fehmarnbelt Fixed Link between Denmark and Germany.

These projects will generate billions of Euros in turnover and thousands of jobs within the region.

"Lolland-Falster" is the joint designation for two rural Danish islands, Lolland and Falster, which are generally handled as one administrative unit due to their proximity and historical ties.

In comparison with other major economic centers in the North of Germany, "the Hanseatic City of Lübeck" offers excellent availability and diversity of land for business and industry. The portfolio is continually being developed and extended. Future industrial areas will be advantageously positioned so that Lübeck-based companies and also new enterprises can continue to enjoy the outstanding infrastructural benefits of the location. All in all the position of this Hanseatic City as a hub of the Baltic region can be strengthened further.

Together with the official partners of **BALTIC FS**, the Gollan Group, Grebien GmbH, Grothe Bau and Lübecker Wachunternehmen wish to offer an all-in package for all work around setting up and operating major construction sites to the companies engaged in big construction projects, so that they can focus fully on their core duties.

When it became clear that one of the biggest European construction projects in history was to be initiated between the German island of Fehmarn and the Danish island of Rødbyhavn, four courageous and far-sighted medium-sized companies - successful and with roots in the region for over a century - joined together to bundle their strengths.

This seminar aims at sharing knowledge about trends and expectations for future developments in industrial areas and real estate in the Fehmarn Belt Region as this will also give an indication of both the opportunities and visions of the actors in the Fehmarn region.

The project "BeltLogistics" was initiated by Wirtschaftsförderung Lübeck GmbH and Roskilde University in connection with the development scheme of the "Fehmarnbelt-Region" 2007-2013 through the EU support program INTERREG IVA.
